# Early Years Centre (Nursery)

The EYC improvement plan continues to take the form of an action plan following our visit from HMIE last November. I will issue a summary of our progress and next steps to nursery parents next week.

Due to the current pandemic, and the associated workload, Kirsty Mahindru, Head of Centre, from Oakburn in Milngavie will be supporting the EYC until Oakburn opens in the New Year.

## In-service

Planned in-service activities for school and nursery are detailed below:

School

- Spelling training whole school approach
- Clicker training supporting literacy skills
- Time to create online/digital learning linked to plans from Oct - Dec 2020

Nursery

- Planning in the moment training
- Self-evaluation linked to PDRs
- E-journal training
- Quality interactions training

#### <u>NUTS</u>

As we have several children in school and EYC who suffer from nut allergies, I would ask that all parents are careful when providing snack and/or lunches. For many allergy sufferers being in the presence of nuts can cause a reaction. Please check food labels carefully and do not send in any products that contain nuts. This will help us make sure everyone is safe.

### Head Lice/Threadworm

Please check your child regularly for both threadworm and head lice. There is no exclusion period should a child have threadworm or head lice, but we would appreciate if parents could contact the school or EYC to confirm any cases as this allows us to establish whether we have an outbreak or not. Please do not post information about outbreaks on social media as it can lead to speculation and/or teasing.

## <u>Vandalism</u>

You may be aware that the school and EYC has been the brunt of continued, low level, vandalism over the last few months. This has involved benches being moved, cycle and scooter racks being moved, bottles being smashed, litter and cans being left lying and children trying to get up onto the roof of the building. If you see any suspicious activity in school grounds, please phone the Police.

#### <u>Students</u>

Student teacher placements will be starting after the October break. We have been given details of the COVID-19 measures that Universities have put in place for student teachers. Each student, similar to any supply member of staff, will meet with me, the Head Teacher, before starting. The school risk assessment will be shared and discussed in detail.

## 'Meet the Teacher' and Reporting Guidance

Traditionally we would have had a meeting the teacher event in school for parents to meet their child's new teacher, see the classroom and get information on planned learning and routines for this term. Unfortunately, this has not been able to happen this session. I hope that the class newsletters sent out a few weeks ago have helped provide some information about learning taking part this session in your child's class. We hope to send out more information in the coming weeks.

Reporting guidance during the Covid pandemic was issued to schools this week. We will be discussing this with staff next week and with our Parent Council, We will share details of agreed reporting systems as soon as we can.

## **Cashless** Catering

There are several schools across the Council who currently have a cashless catering system in place. The plan is for this system to be rolled out to all schools in a phased approach. I will provide you with more details on this as I receive it.

## **Digital Learning/Homework**

A huge part of our recovery plan, which is replacing our usual school improvement plan, is digital learning. It's acknowledged that digital learning needs to continue as a focus in current times and this will involve a significant level of staff training and development. Should any child have to self-isolate, there is an expectation that online learning will be provided.

Staff have been engaging in training since coming back in August. P4-7 have started to access their homework on Microsoft Teams over the last 2 weeks. P1-3 will start accessing homework online after the October break. By setting homework online staff, children and parents will become more and more confident accessing learning in this way.

We appreciate that the use of new digital platforms can be very challenging and will continue to support children and families as much as we can through sessions in class as well as 'How to' guides for parents.

## Outdoor Education

We are now in the position where school trips and outdoor education experiences are now allowed to take place. This is however, is affected by the use of transport which remains under strict restrictions. As residential trips continue to be on hold, we are planning to give our P7s as many outdoor education experiences as possible. This has started with bikeabiltiy sessions during September. We are currently exploring what other experiences we can offer at this time.

## Counselling

You may be aware through lockdown, that virtual/telephone counselling was being offered to all P6 and P7 children. This service is to continue to be offered. We're being allocated one half day a fortnight where children, with parental consent, can take part in counselling via telephone or through virtual meetings. This would happen during the school day. Children can access this service for any reason, but common referrals are for anxiety, low mood, relationship difficulties. If you have a child in P6 or P7 who you feel would benefit from this service, please get in touch.

#### **PE Guidelines**

The guidelines from August in relation to PE have been that PE sessions should take place outdoors. This has been going very well. Most staff and pupils have really been enjoying outdoor PE. The COVID-19 Sub-advisory group has advised that from 5<sup>th</sup> Oct, indoor Physical Education in schools, for pupils of all ages can take place. At the moment our school hall is being used to house furniture from classes that was taken out to free up space and support staff to maintain 2m distance where possible. It's also being used as a breakout staff room and meeting room. The dining hall will be timetabled for PE, but it is envisaged that most classes will continue to use the pitch, so please make sure your child comes to school with warm clothes, especially as things begin to get a bit colder.

## Fundraising Update

# Flu Vaccinations

Flu Vaccinations for school aged children are due to take place on the afternoon of Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> December. Details of how this will be undertaken in the current circumstances are detailed below:

- The Assembly hall will be used. It will be set up in the morning and remain like this all day to ensure hygiene protocols;
- 9 Members of NHS Staff will attend. They will each be provided with a table and chair, 2m apart;
- Children must sanitise hands before going in for their vaccination, and again after;
- NHS staff will be wearing PPE Gloves, mask, visor and apron. School staff will prepare the children for this.
