Spelling Homework


Spelling will be distributed on a Wednesday via Teams, to be completed for the following Tuesday. To complete the homework on Teams would be preferred, however the children do have homework jotters if it is more convenient. Adults should be monitoring and checking their child's homework done online. The children will have a spelling test every Tuesday or Wednesday.

Reading Homework

Over the next few weeks reading homework will be distributed every Tuesday and Friday. Your child should read aloud at home to an adult, observing the punctuation and trying to read with expression showing understanding of the story. There will be a reading marker that will be required to be signed by an adult to indicate completion of the homework.

Maths—Fractions

The children will be learning how to use their times table and division strategies to help them



with fractions of shapes and quantities. They will look at identifying numerators and denominators of simple fractions, and recognising equivalent fractions.
