


As part of our science topic will be creating pictures in response to some different types of music. We

Maths, Outdoor Learning and Sustainable Development Goals



In maths this term we will work on our data handling skills. We will use information gathered from our playground litter pick to create graphs and analyse the data. Our litter pick also helps us towards Sustainable Development Goal 12.

We are very fortunate that we can use our fantastic school grounds to put our maths knowledge into real life contexts.

Remember to regularly practise your tables!! This will help you to read scales and interpret data accurately.



Having recently finished our novel, The Fox Girl and the White Gazelle (which we all really loved), we are now ready to move on. This term we will focus on reading at home using Bug Club: as detailed in the homework leaflet, the expectation is for 4x weekly for a minimum of 15 minutes. Please encourage your child to investigate any new vocabulary they find. In class we will be using a range of materials to focus on key reading skills of summarising, predicting and inferring.

We will also be working on developing our functional writing skills. We will be learning how to take notes, write up science experiments, create fact-files and keep reports and records based upon our science experiments.
